Homework Project

- 1) All children should **read daily** at home – either to an adult or by themselves. Reading non-fiction books and audio books are great ways to engage your child in reading.
- 2) In addition, all children in Year 5 should know their **timetables** but if they aren't yet confident, they should practise them regularly until they become fluent. TTRS or 'Topmarks Maths' are fun, online ways of practising tables.
- 3) We are also sending home some spellings and handwriting sheets to practise – mastering these is essential for progression in UKS2.
- 4) In **History** this half term, we are going to study the Ancient Greeks. We would like you to complete a mini project on the Ancient Greeks to present in the last week of the half term. Below are some ideas that you might like to choose from:

Create Your Own Greek Myth (Short Story)

Write a short myth starring a hero, a magical creature, and a Greek god or goddess. Include a problem, a mythical creature, and a moral. Optional: illustrate one scene.

Make a Mini Greek Pot Design

Using paper, clay or cardboard, draw/make and decorate your own Greek vase. Include a geometric border and a scene from daily Greek life.



Build a Simple Greek Temple Model

Use LEGO, recycled boxes, paper rolls, or craft sticks. Include columns and a triangular roof.



Ancient Greek Olympic Challenge

Choose one Olympic event. Create a mini-poster, a drawing, and two fun facts.

Greek Food Mini-Research

Choose one Ancient Greek food. Draw it, explain where it came from, and say whether you'd like it.
